About Safeline

Safeline is a registered charity established in 1994 that supports people who have been affected by sexual abuse at any time in their lives and works to prevent its occurrence.

We provide a range of tailored and inclusive support and prevention services to adults and children regardless of personal characteristics, backgrounds, and beliefs. We also support family and friends who have been affected.



Prevention & Early Intervention

We work with children in Warwickshire to support vulnerable young people aged 4 -18, who have suffered sexual abuse or are at risk of it

We help them to recover and feel safer. They can access a variety of individual tailored support and mentoring. Self-referrals or referrals from schools and other agencies are welcome.

Services

Safer Relationships Course

Specialist one-to-one, tailored, ageappropriate course covering a range of topics including healthy relationships, consent, online grooming, Child Sexual Exploitation, and image-based abuse.

Prevention Work

A tailored one-to-one. 4-week course for young people who display low-level inappropriate sexualised behaviour. Aiming to promote and support change around behaviours/attitudes.

Whole School Approach

Delivered to all of Year 9, multiple times during the academic year, tackling sexual harassment and sexual assault in schools. Option available to create a student safeguarding forum emphasising cultural change within the school environment.

School Holiday Projects

These projects assist young people in their recovery by participating in fun activities such as art, sport, and drama. These projects encourage young people to meet new friends, increasing their self-esteem and confidence.

Other Short Courses:

Employability course: Developing the knowledge and skills they will need to succeed in the workplace.

No Racism Here project: Supports 9 - 18 year olds who have suffered racism or other forms of racially motivated abuse; and create projects for change.

Peer Support Group

This group is for young people aged 11-18 years, enabling them to share their experiences, gain emotional support, and develop new friendships. The sessions are focused on art, drama, singing, sport, cooking, and a variety of other activities.

Training for adults

Parent Workshop: Understand the risks associated with sexual abuse and internet usage; and how to support your child.

Teacher Training: Equip teachers with knowledge/expertise to tackle sexual abuse in schools.
